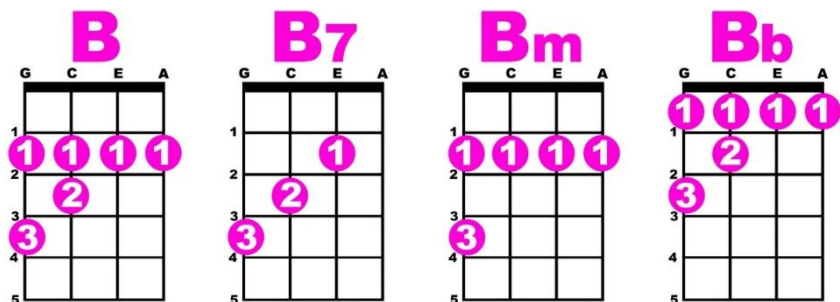
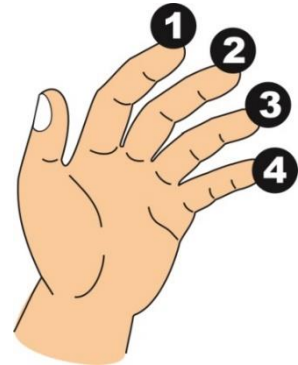
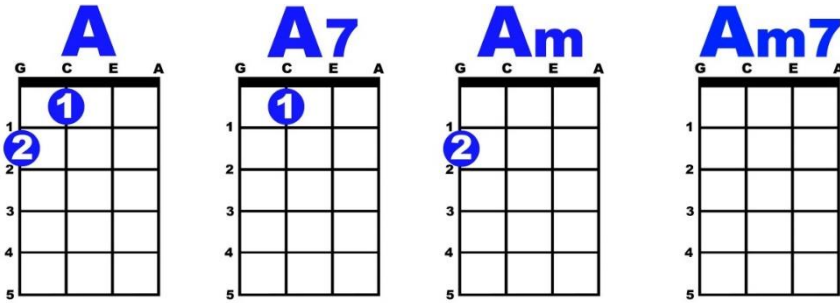
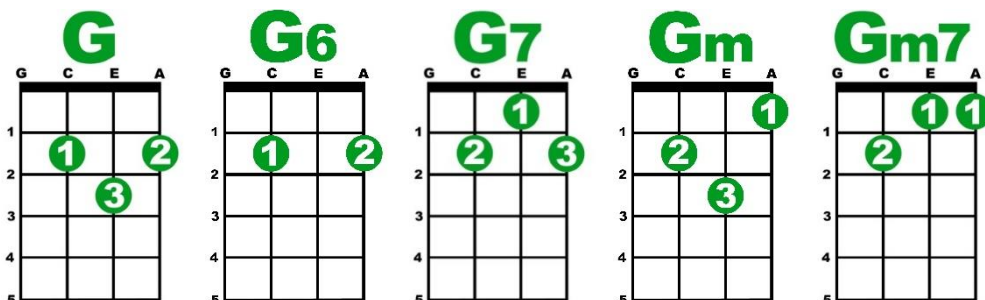
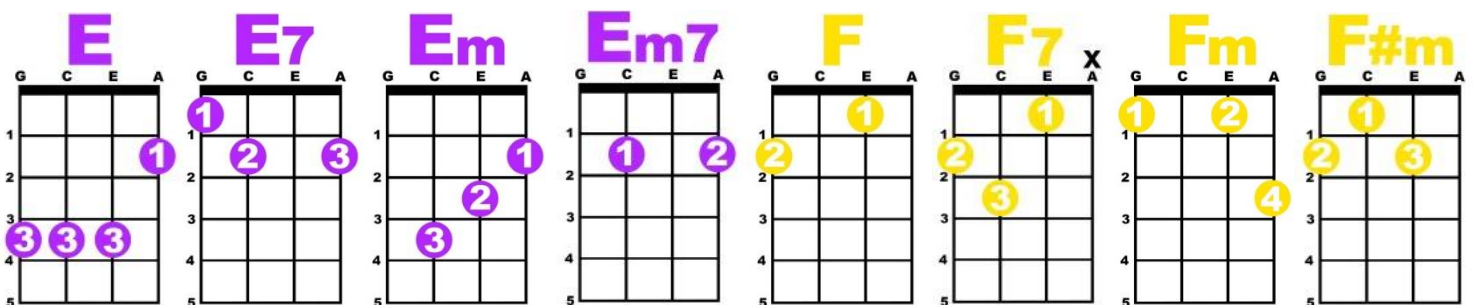
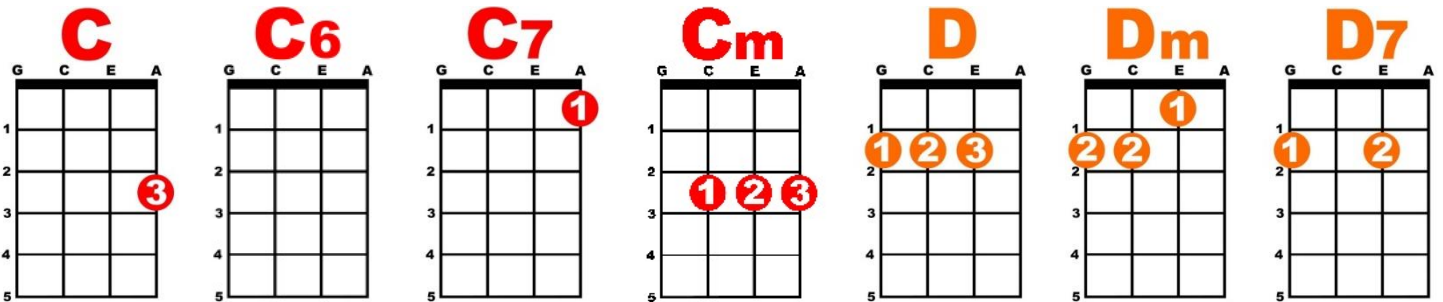


# Essential Ukulele Chords

Each chord can be played in a number of places on the fretboard. The dots on chord diagrams show one way to position your fingers on the fretboard to play the chord. The numbers correspond to the numbers given to your fingers in the hand diagram. There are also a range of ways to position your fingers to play some chords.



For the **A** chord, position your pointer finger on the C string in the first fret space, your middle finger on the G string in the second fret space. Your finger should be placed in the fret space — close to, but not on the fret bar.



**Note:** 1. X above a string, means don't strum this string, e.g. **F7** chord above.  
2. If the same number appears on more than one string, lay your finger down to barre those strings, e.g. **Dm**, **E** and **Gm7** use partial barres.
